What You Need to Bring

Anyone applying for a Florida driver license or ID card must present original documents that prove **identity, Social Security number and residential address**. All driver license and ID card customers must bring documents from each of the three categories below. **For a complete list of acceptable documents, visit WWW.GatherGoGet.COM before visiting a driver license office.**

1. Identification:

U.S. Citizens (BRING ONE)

Bring one of the following original documents as proof of your identity:

- Certified U.S. birth certificate, including territories and District of Columbia (A hospital birth certificate is not acceptable.)
- Valid U.S. passport
- Certificate of naturalization
- Consular report of birth abroad

Legal Name Change (if applicable)

- Original or certified copy of all marriage certificates or court orders that show name change(s). (Uncertified photocopies and church marriage certificates are not valid.)

Immigrants: Bring one of the following:

- Alien registration receipt card (green card, Form I-551)
- Current I-551 stamp in passport or on I-94
- Immigration judge's order with applicant's A-number granting asylum
- I-797, with A-number indicating granting of asylum, with additional identification
- I-797 or another form from the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) with the applicant's A-number, stating approval of refugee status, with additional identification
